there are two ways for using START: hosted on the softconf web servers and locally installed on the user machines.

If you are going to act as a "user" of START V2, you will be able to use START from your MAC, because it will be basically a normal web application (in any case we suggest the usage of Firefox and not Safari due to a longstanding Safari Bug on file uploads).

We usually do not support the usage of MACs as "servers" for START. As long as MAC OSX supports all the commands typical for a Unix machine (apache, perl, tar, grep, ...) I think there should be no problem. As long as I know MAC OSX should have most of the software available for Unix since the FreeBSD ports are available.
